GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The student's Grade Point Average (GPA) is based on all graded credit-bearing coursing with passing and failing grades given equal weight on a 4.0 scale, except for Advanced Placement and dual enrollment courses which are weighted on a 5.0 scale. A cumulative weighted and non-weighted GPA is reported on students' transcripts. The transcript also contains course codes, titles, grades and credits/units awarded.

CURRICULUM

Lakeside High School offers a diverse curriculum designed to meet the individual needs of every student .

Advanced Placement Course examinations are evaluated and scored on a five-point scale where a five is the highest score. Students scoring within the 3 to 5 score range are potentially eligible for college credit and are indicating their well-qualified college entrance performance.

Career and Technology Education Programs: Audio/ Visual Technology, & Film, Web & Digital Communications, Health Care Science, Criminal Justice, Engineering & Technology, Computer Science, Culinary Arts, Nutrition & Food Science, Teaching as a Profession, Business Accounting, and Marketing & Management, and JROTC.

Dual Enrollment— This program allows students to simultaneously earn high school and college credit for courses taken at post-secondary institutions. Courses are offered both on and off campus. Lakeside High School

currently has over 100 students participating in the dual enrollment program.

Fernbank Science Center—Offers classes for freshman students through the Scientific Tools & Technology and for upper classmen through Advanced Studies. These courses are designed for students interested in pursuing a degree in the sciences.

Talented and Gifted Programs serves approximately 34% of Lakeside student body. .

Services for Students with Disabilities: Lakeside High School is offers programs and services serving students with special needs and exceptionalities.
