**CLASS SCHEDULE**

Lakeside High School's school year is comprised of 180 days. Students are on a 7-period day, with classes at 50 minutes. Lakeside is on a semester schedule and credit is awarded at the end of each semester.

**CLASS RANK**

The DeKalb County School District discontinued the computation of exact numeric class rank in 1975. Counselors can report an estimated class rank by decile, only.

**GRADE POINT AVERAGE**

The student's Grade Point Average (GPA) is based on all graded credit-bearing coursing with passing and failing grades given equal weight on a 4.0 scale, except for Advanced Placement and dual enrollment courses which are weighted on a 5.0 scale. A cumulative weighted and non-weighted GPA is reported on students' transcripts. The transcript also contains course codes, titles, grades and credits/units awarded.

**CLASS OF 2019 GPA**

- 101 (21%) students earned 4.0 +
- 125 (26%) students earned 3.5—3.9
- 108 (22%) students earned 3.0—3.49

**CLASS OF 2019 POST-SECONDARY**

- 90% of graduates will attend a post-secondary academic institution
- 85% will go to a 4-year college or university
- 5% will go to a 2-year, or technical school
- 3% will go into Military Service

## CURRICULUM

Lakeside High School offers a diverse curriculum designed to meet the individual needs of every student .

**Advanced Placement Course** examinations are evaluated and scored on a five-point scale where a five is the highest score. Students scoring within the 3 to 5 score range are potentially eligible for college credit and are indicating their well-qualified college entrance performance.

**Career and Technology Education Programs:** Audio/Visual Technology, & Film, Web & Digital Communications, Health Care Science, Criminal Justice, Engineering & Technology, Computer Science, Culinary Arts, Nutrition & Food Science, Teaching as a Profession, Business Accounting, and Marketing & Management, and JROTC.

**Dual Enrollment— This program allows** students to simultaneously earn high school and college credit for courses taken at post-secondary institutions. Courses are offered both on and off campus. Lakeside High School

currently has over 100 students participating in the dual enrollment program.

**Fernbank Science Center**—Offers classes for freshman students through the Scientific Tools & Technology and for upper classmen through Advanced Studies. These courses are designed for students interested in pursuing a degree in the sciences.

**Talented and Gifted Programs** serves approximately 34% of Lakeside student body. .

**Services for Students with Disabilities:** Lakeside High School is offers programs and services serving students with special needs and exceptionalities.

Lakeside has a professional staff of 163 including 125 teachers, 7 administrators, and 6 counselors. The professional staff has an average of 18 years of experience in education and 75% have advanced degrees.
