Department Philosophy: Improve academic achievement through a rigorous, engaging curriculum.

Course Description: This is the second of two theme-related, literature-based, integrated courses focused on the study of British literature designed for students reading at or above grade level. The literature is chronologically divided into historical literary periods, beginning with the Restoration period and ending with the Twentieth century. We integrate literary devices, content, style, and cultural diversity, vocabulary, library and research skills, public speaking, various forms of composition, standardized test preparation, as well as the use of current technology into the semester's study. Students improve grammar and usage skills through guided exercises. We place emphasis on the development of critical and analytical thinking skills through classroom discussion and writing.

CCGPS Standards: We will thoroughly examine each goal and standard in the classroom, but the standards are available for personal reference online. They are also referenced in the curriculum map posted on FirthNotes.

Tardy/Detention Policy:

Teachers will close or lock doors after the bell and existing tardy policy will be enforced. Students arriving to school after 8:05AM will check in at the Attendance Office to receive an excused or unexcused pass. Official Senior Skip Day: Does not exist. Our "official" holidays are January 20, February 17, and April 7-11. You are accountable for work done on every official school day, and any assignment issued on any *unofficial* "senior skip days" may only be made up with an *excused* absence. Note: college visits are *not* excused absences. In order to make up assignments from college visit days, your parent/guardian must notify me of your intention to visit a college *in advance*.

Late Assignments/Make-up Policy: Late and/or make-up assignments will only be accepted in accordance with the regulations outlined in the DCSD Code of Conduct. All missing assignments will be recorded as a zero (0) in the gradebook until the grade is resolved. All handouts are available in a notebook at the front of the classroom to all students at all times. **The very last day (Drop-Dead Due Date) is FRIDAY, MAY 9.** All outstanding zeroes in the gradebook must be resolved by 3:45PM on 5/09/14 or they will be permanent.
